## Team "Debate" -- Triage

## The Situation

A nuclear apocalypse has devastated the United States, killing millions and leaving more millions in desperate need of medical attention. <u>Position 1:</u> People who have the best chance of survival (i.e. the least sick or wounded, the youngest, and those having the best health prospects generally) should receive the elixir first.
